3.A. Brief Schools Update, Fall - Dr. Sonia Sanchez/ Dr. Salma Boyd introduced Mr. Wilson to speak on the progress at Gus Garcia

- Gus Garcia 2025-2026 School Wide Goals
- Goal #1 by end of year 2026. 70% of students will demonstrate growth in reading and math based on MAP STAAR proficiency projection, serving as the leading indicator for achieving 67% of students meeting growth on STAAR. These goals are aligned with Domain 2 accountability targets for School Progress and Academic Growth.
- Goal # 2 by end of year 2026, 44% of students taking TELPAS will progress by at least one composite proficiency level, and 33% of SPED students will meet at approaches across all subjects. These goals are aligned with Domain 3 accountability targets for Academic Achievement and Progress in Achieving English Language Proficiency.
- Goal #3 by June 2026, Gu Garcia University School will reduce referrals as follows: students with 1-3 referrals will decrease from 59% to 40, students with 4-5 referrals will decrease from 22% to 15%, and students with 5 or more referrals will decrease from 11% TO 8% or fewer. These reductions will restore instructional time and improve students' engagement across all grade levels.
- Mr. Wilson stated celebrations on campus attendance around the same as last year with 200 more students, and the MOY Staff climate survey shows movement in the right direction. Monthly parent/principal meeting (Next meeting on January 29). Established a weekly campus newsletter for the first semester (Communication rated high on survey). Strong Performance in Algebra. PBIS Monthly events.
