- 2. **Communication from Citizens**: Dr. Henrietta Munoz stated we have two communications from citizens.

- The first citizen, Ms. Agapita Jaramillo, stated her concerns about the CIS Program at Gus Garcia and bringing it back to after school. Also, she stated the concern about keeping principals, which is very important for our students.
- The second citizen, Ms. Melody Herrera, stated the minutes did not reflect the citizens to be heard and requested that minutes reflect her comments. Ms. Herrera also asked for better communication to alert the community on when Board Meeting were to be held and where to go for communication; she requested better marketing of meetings for parents at Gus Garcia, try to send out communications on Facebook, social media that would be very helpful to the community.

3. Chief Executive Officer's Report:

Update of current events, information, operations, and programs

- Dr. Munoz will read the ISCP Mission statement.
- Dr. Munoz stated that two conferences that staff attended, 1st Conference was TEA Texas Education Agency-System of Great Schools and Texas College & Career Readiness School model, both conferences were a requirement by TEA if you are participating in certain models Early College High School and PTech.
- Dr. Munoz, wanted to share because of the great work of Grace Aguirre- Garcia we are moving forward with Project Search; to include a Project Search Teacher who will be on the Institute side and who will be dedicated to rolling out the curriculum with EISD sped program at Burleson.
- Dr. Munoz shared a few memories and photos for Winston Intermediate School of Excellence.

3.A. Winston Intermediate School of Excellence End of Year and Campus:

• Dr. Sanchez stated that the data around measures of academic progress in both math and reading. In observation the beginning to the end of year, and how each grade level

One of the observations is the 3RD grade regress just a little bit, but when you look at the 4TH and 5th grade, there was growth from the beginning of the year to the end.

- Dr. Sanchez stated the data measures for Reading Data in Spanish from beginning to end of the year, you see growth in 3rd grade and 4th grade and 5th grade while beginning of the year.
- Dr. Munoz asked Dr. Sanchez to explain the MAP assessment briefly know what the assessment measures, the Math skills measures of set of skills that mirror the STAAR Skills that needed to be successful at that. So, MAP data can project what STAAR scores and STAAR performance will look like it's aligned to state standard, not the same scope and sequence as the district, or that our curriculum has laid out.
- Dr. Sanchez wanted to share with the board the data report and little bit about the story behind the data and what it represents, and all the great things that happened and all the things that did work, it is about the transformation and culture practices and how that impacted students.

3.B. Fund Development:

- Dr. Janysek gave updates on all fund development.
- New Schools Innovation Fund awarded \$215.000 focus for Success Adult Early College and High School passed the Technical Review moved to full review should know by late August/September
- Toyota Foundation Community Grant Program for 2024-2025 school year, field-based Stem Learning experiences for field trips, around \$55,000
- United Way Successful Students due August 30,2024 opportunity youth-aligns with our Adult Early College High School requires 25% co-investment (New school funds)
- US Department of Education: Disability Innovation Fund due July 8, 2024, to document and replicate Burleson Enhanced Model, to support innovative activities to increase competitive integrated employment for youth and other individuals with disabilities.
- Promise Neighborhood anticipated call Summer 2024, partner United Way of SA/Bexar Co, prior submission 2022 almost perfect score.
- Dr. Janysek stated for all external grants and gifts she will update the 3 years over for next school year 2024-2025.

3.C. Early Matters San Antonio Update:

- Mark Larson gave updates on new staffing with Early Matters, Dr. Todd Landry,
 Directory of Operation and system alliance. Victor Azios, Advisor for Family and
 Community Partnerships. Selena Walsh, Directory of Policy
- Mark stated they submitted a grant to USAA which is a re-up of \$150, 000.00 to support the work with the Early Matters Roadmap.
- Mark stated they submitted a proposal to the Moody Foundation, their recommendation was for \$300.000.00 a year for 3 years.
